
Suggested 7 Night **Self-drive Itinerary**

Day 1: Start your trip in historic Launceston, exploring the Tamar Valley wine route and visit a selection of Tasmania's finest wineries. A recommended lunch stop is Strathlynn, at Rosevears. Continue north and visit Aviemore Blueberry and Cheese Farm, Seahorse World and Platypus House at Beauty Point. See George Town's colonial buildings and lighthouse, or visit more wineries and vineyards - Delamere, Dalrymple and Pipers Brook. For another day trip from Launceston the Bridestowe Estate Lavendar Farm is just north of Nabowla

Overnight - Launceston

DAY 4: Explore Sullivan's Cove, Hobart's waterfront, where settlers came ashore in 1804. Wander around the historic waterfront to Salamanca Place (markets every Saturday), then to Battery Point with its Georgian cottages, art and craft shops and popular restaurants. A 20 minute drive takes you to the top of Mt Wellington (1,271 meters) for a stunning panoramic vista of Hobart and the Derwent River. This afternoon experience Cascade, Cadbury and the Lark Whisky distillery on the popular Taste Hobart Tour.

DAY 2: Travel via the North East Coast farmlands to the scenic East Coast. Look out for the Pancake parlour at Elephant's Pass, between the Chain of Lagoons and St Marys. Meet a Tasmanian Devil and other wildlife at the East Coast Natureworld. Take the A3 south to the Coles Bay turn off - the gateway to the Freycinet National Park. Explore the quiet sheltered beaches and take the breathtaking 30 minute walk to the lookout over looking Wineglass Bay's gleaming cresent of sand. Stop for dinner at the stunning Freycinet Lodge - a chance to enjoy some fresh Tasmanian seafood. Overnight - Swansea



DAY 5: Wind your way along the mighty Derwent River to historic New Norfolk which has a fine collection of heritage buildings, antique stores and Australia's oldest Anglican church. Stop for morning tea at the nearby Salmon Ponds, then follow the signs to the Mt Field National Park- take a walk to the impressive Russell Falls. Continuing on the Lyell Highway travel west via Ouse, stop for lunch at Tarraleah, an old Hydro town or at Lake St Clair - the end of the famous Overland Track. Continue on to the West Coast for a 2 night stay. Overnight - Strahan



DAY 8: Explore one Tasmania's most famous National Parks - Cradle Mountain including Dove Lake and Waldheim Chalet, the home of the area's first pioneers. Enjoy a selection of varying grades of walks suitable for all abilities. Head north from Cradle Mountain to the 'Town of Murals' - Sheffield - an alternative to staying at Cradle Mountain or a great morning tea stop. From Sheffield you have time to explore more of Tasmania's north or catch a flight from Launceston, Burnie or Devonport or sail home on the Spirit of Tasmania.



DAY 3: Before departing Swansea call in for some delicious homemade ice-cream and fruit at Kate's Berry Farm. Follow the scenic drive south past the convict-built Spikey Bridge (c1841) through the fishing village, Triabunna. Take the Maria Island Ferry to Maria Island where convict buildings date from 1825 (you will have to take all your provisions with you for your time on this beautiful National Park island). Contiune onto Hobart. Tonight dine at one of the many restaurants on Elizabeth Street in North Hobart or near the waterfront.

DAY 6: Today you will experience Tasmania's true wilderness aboard a cruise on the Gordon River. A luxury catamaran will take you into Macquarie Harbour, past the convict ruins on Sarah Island and into the Gordon River. Lunch is included and make sure you take your camera with you; the reflections of the wilderness rainforestin the dark water are remarkable. The cruise ends around 3.30pm, so spend the late afternoon browsing the town centre shops; several art and craft shops , some woodturners and lovely Huon Pine Souvenirs. Alternatively, join the West Coast Wilderness Railway from Strahan to Queenstown and return via coach. The 5 hour tour takes you through stunning wilderness country on the restored rail line connecting Strahan and Queenstown. Overnight - Strahan

Taste Hobart Tour

Hobart: The must do tour of Hobart's icons! Indulge at the Cadbury Chocolate Shop. Concluding at the Lark Distillery, you will taste some of the finest liqueurs, spitits and whiskies in Australia. Includes bonues and excellent interpretation.

Discover sealife and giant kelp forests with our exclusive underwater cameras. Includes lunch onboard and a shore excursion to Peppermint Bay.

Par Avion Wilderness Tours

Hobart: Award winning flights to Tasmania's World Heritage South West wilderness. Huon let

Huon Valley: Enjoy an exhilarating 35 minute ride on the magnificent Huon River, only 30 minutes from Hobart. Travel 12 km up the picturesque Huon River at speeds of up to 80 kilometres per hour, whilst negotiating gentle rapids. Departs daily at 11am and 2pm.

Huon Valley: Walk above the treetop canapy, 40 metres above the ground. Exhilarating, yet suitable for all ages, the 627 metre walk allows close up views of some of the most beautiful trees in the southern forests including Celery Top Pines, Sassafras, Myrtle and towering Eucalypts. The walk is suspended above the Picton River.

World Heritage Cruises

West Coast: Cruise the Gordon River with the family owned and operated company which pioneered cruises on the Gordon River over one hundred years ago. Visit Hells Gates, a fish farm and stopover at Sarah Island convict settlement. Tour includes onboard commentary and a buffet lunch.

West Coast Wilderness Railway

Vest Coast: Clamber through 35km of tight curves, spectacular bridges, rugged wilderness, dense rain-forest and steep gorges. Departs Strahan and Queenstown daily (& afternoon during peak season). Choose from one-way rail with coach return or return rail at extra cost.

West Coast: Glide along the Gordon River onboard Lady Jane Franklin II, designed for World Heritage Area access, ensuring minimal impact to one of the world's last remaining pristine river systems. Includes buffet lunch and commentory. Ask about upgrading to the Captains Premier Upper-Deck.

North West Coast: A 75 minute cruise to view Australian Fur Seals. Pass by the famous Stanley Nut to arrive at Bull Rock, 500 metres from the Tasmanian coastline. You are guaranteed excellent viewing of the Fur Seals.

unceston: Multi-award winning. Cruise into the spectacular Cataract Gorge, then down the river past Tamar Island, historic Freshwater Point, the vineyards and Batman Bridge. Morning tea, superb light lunch, Tasmanian cheese and fruit platter, wine tasting, commentary and unlimited tea and coffee. Another option is the Cataract Gorge 50 minute cruise.

Beauty Point: The world's first seahorse farm, situated at Beauty Point, only 35 minutes from Launceston in the stunning Tamar Valley. Open daily from 9.30am, with fully guided tours and fish feeding on each tour. An amazing experience that can be included with other attractions in the area.

Bicheno Penguin Tours

East Coast: Experience penguins in their natural environment at Bicheno's rookery. Small groups are guided to the rookery to view the penguins, returning one hour later to the Penguin Tour Shop.

East Coast: Pink granite mountains, pristine white sandy beaches and blue waters so clear you feel you can touch the marine life below. Experience the Freycinet Paddle - a 3 hour fully guided sea kayak tour in Freycinet National Park.

































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
